Abundance Codes

These codes are given for each species to indicate relative abundance. As with all populations of birds, general abundance can vary from year to year and season to season. They are, then intended to indicate which species are most likely seen on a given morning. The codes are C: common; F: frequent; U: uncommon; O: occasional; R: rare; Vag: vagrant. The latter code indicates a species that has been reported on fewer than 5 occasions during the last 30 years.

Status Codes

Status codes indicate the temporal occurrence and breeding biology of each species. Some species can be found in the canyon on a year-round basis, in which case they are coded as a resident (**Res**). Others are winter visitors, arriving in Fall and departing in Spring (**WV**). Still, others summer visitors (**SV**), arriving in late Spring, usually breeding in the canyons, and departing in Fall. The final category, migrants (**M**), are species that pass through the canyon on a migratory basis only- that is, they are observed here on their way to breeding habitat elsewhere during the Spring, and returning from their breeding areas in the Fall. Note that the status does not necessarily indicate a species breeds in the canyon.

Breeding Codes

These codes attempt to define breeding status of a particular species in the canyon. Any species suspected of breeding in the area is noted with a **Br** code. The level of confirmation is indicated by a **Po** for possibly breeding in the canyon; **Pr** for probable breeding status; **Co** for confirmed breeding evidence; and **H** for species that have historically bred in the canyon, but for which there has been no breeding evidence in the past 20 years. In some cases, the date of last known breeding is noted. Breeding activity varies, but usually consists of observing a singing male bird during the breeding season, a species pair, nest building activity, feeding young in a nest, and lastly directly observing a nest with eggs or young. 3/03/13 155 species.

Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation PLACERITA CANYON NATURAL AREA **BIRD LIST**

Placerita Canyon is located at the western end of the San Gabriel Mountains 2 miles south of the Santa Clara River, between the San Fernando and Santa Clarita Valleys. The broad, expansive oak woodlands, chaparral covered hillsides, and lush riparian woodlands make the canyon a popular and diverse location for bird observation. During the spring migration, many species of warblers, vireos, and flycatchers, along with many resident species can be seen. In general, late April through May is the peak of bird migration through the area.

The list covers all species observed in the canyon from the Nature Center to Walker Ranch on either side of the canyon, including the pond on the north side of Placerita Canyon Road at mid-gate.

Any additions to this list, such as new breeding observations, new species for the canyon, or any corrections are welcomed and should be reported to the Nature Center. Names of birds listed in this checklist follow the National Geographic Field Guide to the Birds of North America, 1999.
